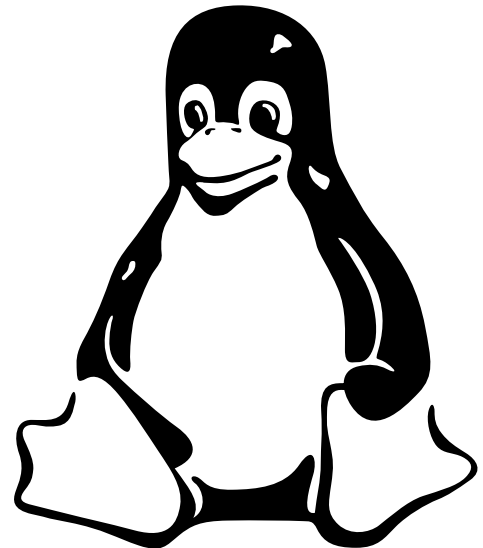

What is the difference between LinuxWiki and other GNU/Linux web sites?

- *Everyone may contribute*, edit and link the contents – just using a browser
- You can access all older versions of a page, no changes are lost
- Be up-to-date at a glance using the „RecentChanges“ feature
- LUG activists: make your homepages more dynamical, move them into LinuxWiki
- Linux users: Create a personal *WikiHomepage* and get to know others with similar interests
- *No special knowledge is required* (e.g. about HTML), everything is straightforward: editing and adding pages, „automagical“ creation of links (even backlinks), flexible categorization
- *More efficient* than other media (email, news, chat, boards, WWW)
- Uses the principles of the Free Software and Open Source community for documentation and aggregation of knowledge
- Generally: Wiki technology is also suitable for company intranets/extranets or as a Personal Information Manager

Current State

LinuxWiki.org is a Wiki for all Linux and Free Software users. It started in German language in the first half of 2002 and has grown to more than 1700 pages in the meantime. We are currently working on multiple language support (English, French and every other language there is demand for) and will switch to that "multilang" Wiki soon. Thus there will be an easy way for international, productive and free cooperation between Linux users.

LinuxWiki.org currently contains, but is not limited to:

- A knowledge base for Linux basics and software, links, tips, micro-howtos, FAQs.
- Linux User Group Wiki pages, calendars and common resources
- Personal Wiki pages of Linux Users – a nice way to get to know each other better

LinuxWiki as an online LUG – always-on, asynchronous, massively parallel
